I am so pleased that Neil, having been for his induction with me a few months ago, now goes to the gym every week. I've been going to the same gym at Coventry Sports Centre for 7 years and I hope Neil loves it as much as I do. The gym is fully accessible and many instructors are IFI-trained (see <a href="http://www.efds.co.uk/inclusive\_fitness">http://www.efds.co.uk/inclusive\_fitness</a>).

Catherine spoke about how much hearing aids benefit her. Ataxia can affect hearing, it does mine, and so i listened to Catherine's experiences with interest. At last month's annual conference I was also interested to hear about Ataxia UK's research into this and how they'll soon be developing a trial of hearing devices.
